AmeriCorps NCCC is a federal, national service program for 18- to 24-year-olds that strengthens communities and develops leaders through team-based national and community service. AmeriCorps NCCC partners with organizations like yours to meet community-identified needs while developing our members personally and professionally.



## Who Can Receive A Team?

Qualifying organizations include:

- Nonprofit & faith-based organizations
- Government entities (federal, state & local)
- Public schools & universities
- Native American tribal councils

## What Do Our Teams Do?

Project service areas include:

- Natural and Other Disasters
- Environmental stewardship
- Energy conservation
- Infrastructure improvement
- Urban and rural development

## How Do You Apply For A Team?

Applications are handled by Assistant Program Directors (APDs.) To apply:

- Submit a full application by the applicable deadline – 2026 dates are still being determined.

## NCCC Provides:

- A team of 8-10 members with various backgrounds
- Team Leader to coordinate team (Team Leader is not a technical skills supervisor)
- Van and fuel for team transportation
- Food budget for the team to prepare their own meals
- Basic Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): hardhats, gloves, ear and eye protection, masks, boots, coveralls
- Members are covered by Federal Tort Claims Act & Federal Employees' Compensation Act and screened with a fingerprinted FBI criminal background check

## Sponsoring Organizations Must Provide:

- Thorough application that describes your project and demonstrates your ability to host a team
- Housing for the team, to include a full kitchen, full bathroom with showers, cleaning supplies, and toilet paper for the duration of project and on-site transition
- All project materials, tools, and related protective gear
- Any work permits required to complete service tasks
- Daily technical supervision for team; on-the-job training
- Orientation to the organization and community
- Service-Learning education on the community needs and deeper issues pertaining to the project
- At least **40 hours a week** of enriching service that meets the needs outlined in the application



## Make Your Application Stand Out!

We believe that project sponsors are some of the best resources for our members' professional and personal development. We ask that you and your staff get positively and proactively involved with your team around four primary areas of member development:

- **Service-Learning**
- **Communication**
- **Coaching**
- **Feedback**



If your project involves any of the following elements of interest, please highlight them in your application.

- Project includes a range of service experiences for the team
- Service recipients are veterans or military families
- Service includes mitigation, preparation, or recovery from disasters
- Service includes coordinating or recruiting other volunteers
- Service has high community exposure for the team (media, interaction with public officials)
- Service addresses priorities identified by state leaders
- Service includes specific plans to recruit future NCCC members from your local area institutions such as high schools, career and vocational schools, colleges, and other youth programs
- Social media posts about the project
